

Reservation

The Original Colville Indian Reservation was established by Presidential Executive Order April 9, 1872 and was originally twice as large as it is today.

In July of 1872 less than three months after the original Colville Reservation was established it was exchanged for the present reservation.

Executive Order vs. Treaty Tribe


Executive

Definition: Recognizes tribal rights of self-government and tribal sovereignty, and affirmed and committed the Federal government to a work with Native American tribal governments on a government-to-government basis. This is issued by the President.

Treaty

Definition: A treaty is a contract, a binding and legal agreement, between two or more sovereign nations. By signing treaties with Indian tribes, the United States acknowledged tribal sovereign status. When the architects of the American government created the Constitution, they explicitly recognized that treaties are the supreme law of the land, along with the Constitution itself.







- 2nd Primary Elections
- 3rd General Elections
 - Final verdict



Elections held in June every 2 yrs. Sworn in in July (Positions Alt)

Diff. Parts of governmental structure CBC oversees.

Meetings meet 1st & 3rd full week of each month

Consider Proposals for Resolutions to be approved by Committees

What's a Resolution

A firm decision approved by CBC through an approval process where majority of CBC votes yes.

•In comparison, it's a law that the CCT membership must follow and CBC will help enforce
